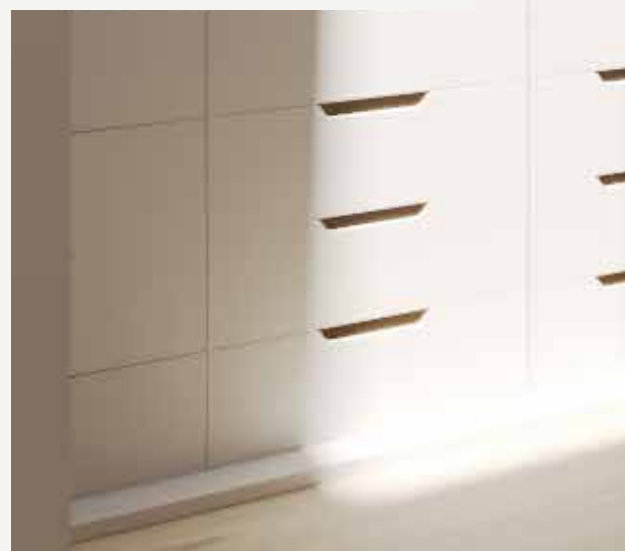

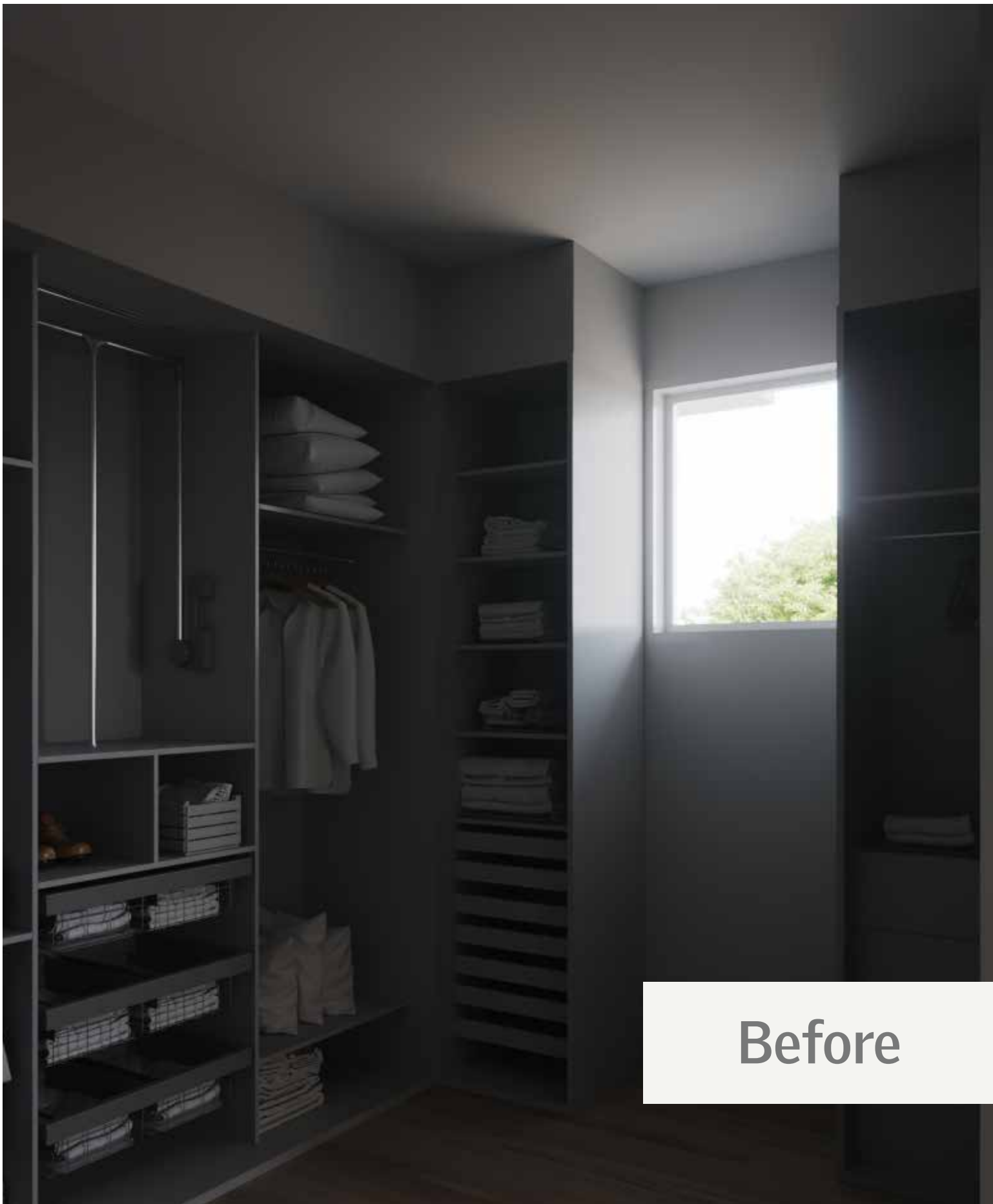

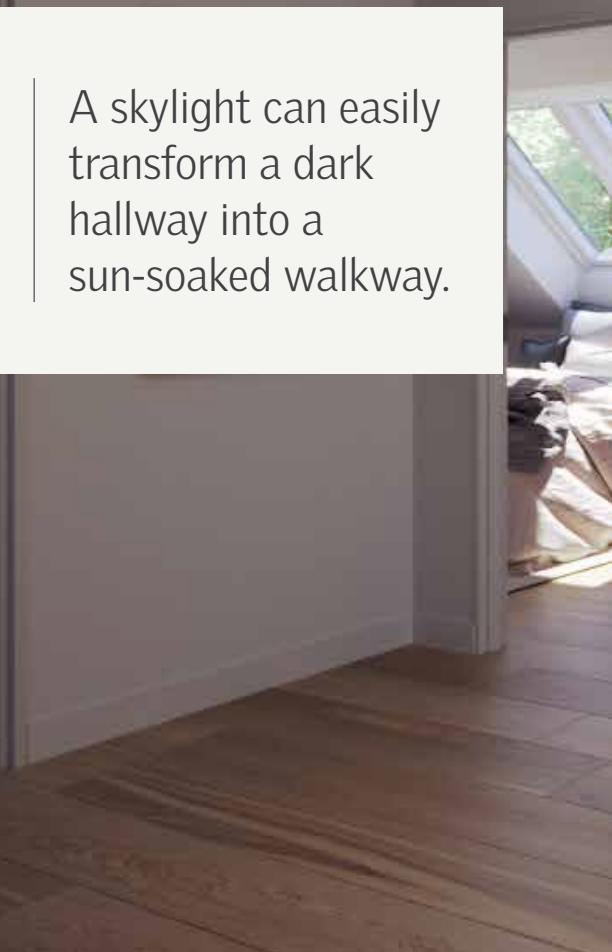

Because sun tunnels are so easy to maneuver during installation, putting in multiple tunnels at once is a time-saving option for lighting up the entire length of your hallway. And sun tunnels aren't just one of the most cost-effective skylights to install, they also deliver far less heat than many standard skylights.

With sun tunnel skylights, you can bring daylight into even your darkest hallways. And sun tunnel domes can be mounted to almost any type of roofing material, so there's really no excuse not to install a bit of sunshine in your hallways!

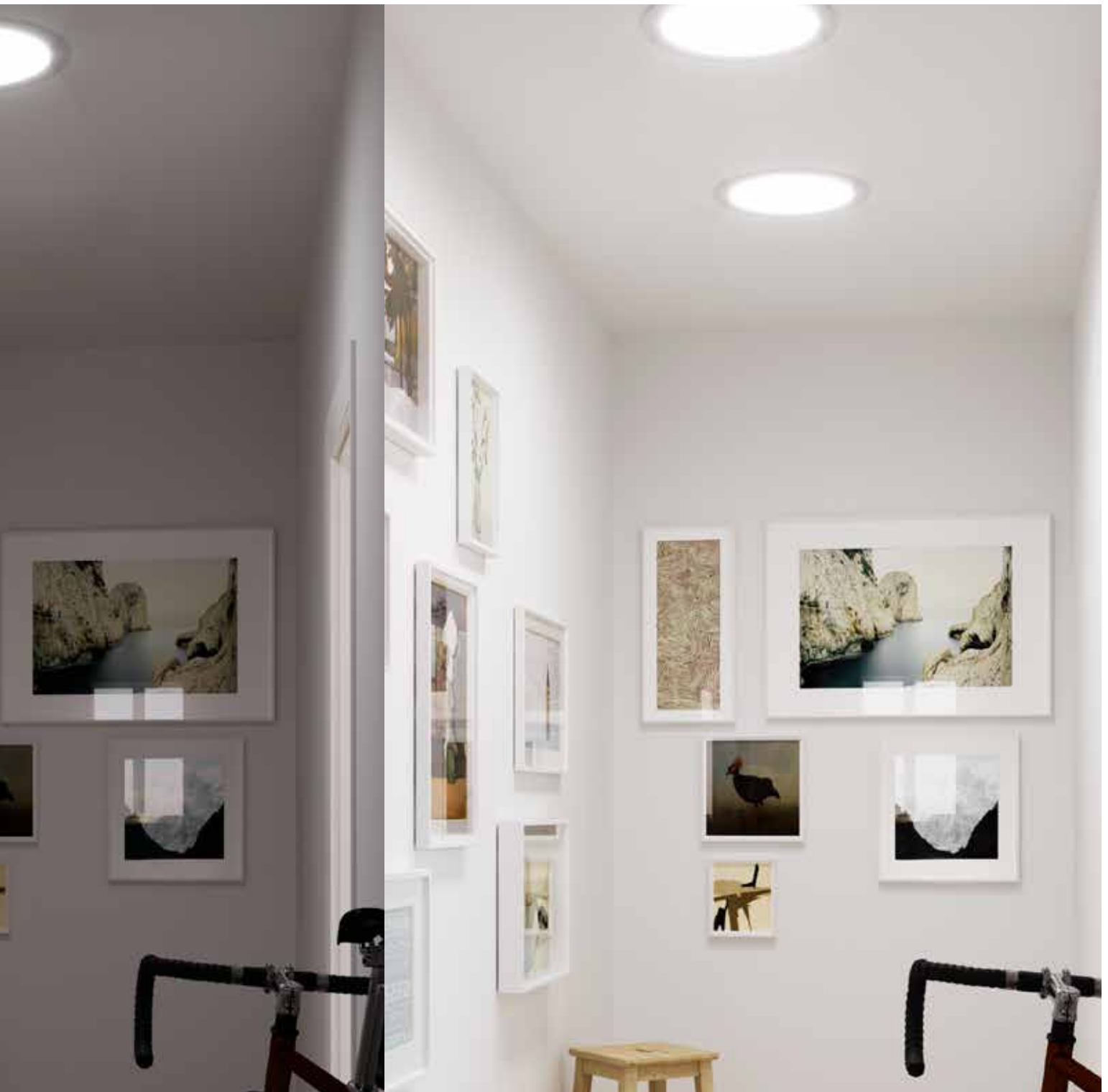

Chances are, you're not utilizing your closet space to your full advantage. Thankfully, all

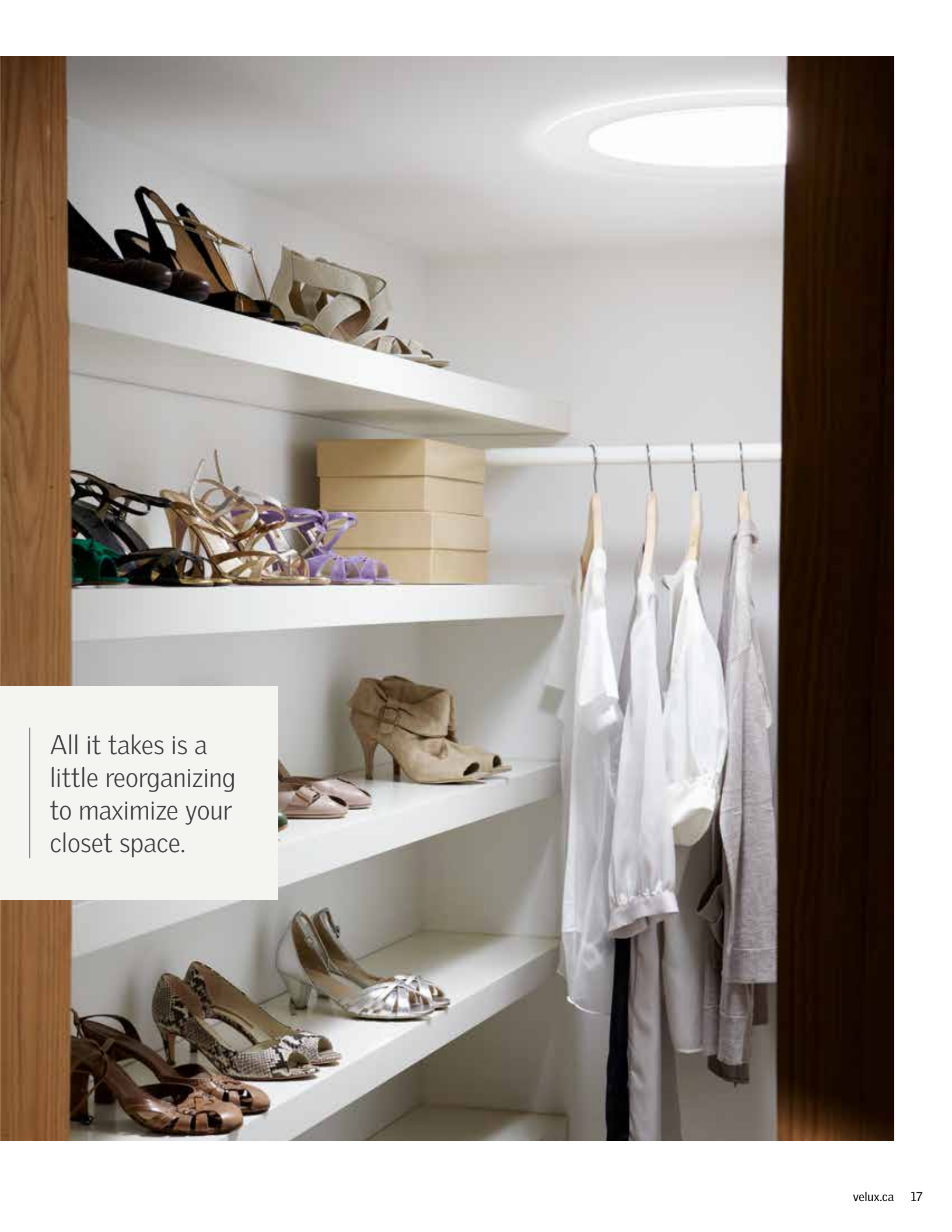
